- Ausschreibung in zwei Schritten – dazwischen verbindliche Zusagen der Länder
- DESY wird die nötigen Länder-Statistiken bereitstellen
- Zwei Arbeitsgruppen formieren sich jetzt

Organisation

- “A **steering committee**, representing the broad cross-section of the SCOAP³ partnership. This committee will **co-ordinate the tendering process and the related decisions, provide the exact tender requirements**, liaise with the technical legal and purchasing services at CERN for the execution and adjudication of the tender, and move the initiative through its next phases.”
